Responsibilities

- Utilize a trauma informed, motivational enhancement and cognitive behavioral model of therapy.

- Maintain positive and professional relationships with individuals and organizations involved with the target population, including referral sources and other community organizations, for the purpose of communicating and collaborating with individuals and organizations.
- Maintains strict confidentiality in accordance with federal and state regulations, and consistent with ethical standards in the field.
- Deliver services in Child and Family Charities offices and at youth serving locations in the community.
- Participates in individual clinical supervision, clinical team meetings and ongoing professional training activities

Master's Degree in Social Work or Counseling.

Full Licensure desired and CADC preferred.

Minimum one year of applicable experience in assessment and therapeutic interventions with adolescents and families required.

Minimum one year of direct services providing substance abuse treatment desired. Experience providing manual based therapy desired

Experience addressing trauma desired.
