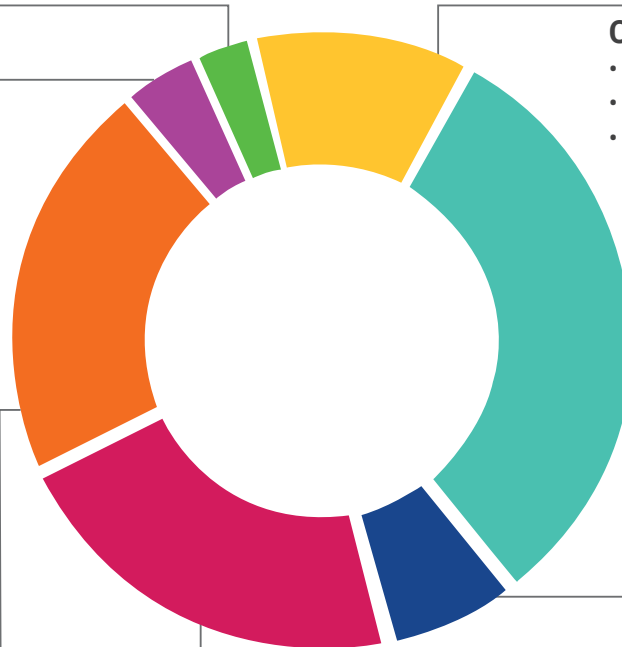

2018 Program Data Outcomes

GIVING HOPE TO THOUSANDS

Gateway Youth Services



Outreach to **4,139 YOUTH** and **1,920 ADULTS**



- 411** youth received information and referrals for local food pantries, soup kitchens and other food resources
- 103** youth were housed in 2018
- 84** youth received counseling services
- 131** youth received case management services across all Gateway programs
- 97%** of youth completed their programs with improved life skills

- 88%** of youth in emergency shelter continued attending school while in care
- 94%** of youth in the Transitional Living Program were either enrolled in school or had completed their diploma or GED. Some were attending community college
- 70%** of youth in the Supportive Housing Program and the Kevin J. Moody Youth Home either enrolled in school or have completed their diploma/GED!

Juvenile Justice

- 113** youth were served through the Teen Court program which included an accountability hearing, assessment, counseling, Street Law classes and more
- 226** students received Truancy Reduction Services, including counseling, assessment, parenting support training, and more
- 503** volunteer high school peer jurors were trained and participated in accountability hearings for Teen Court
- 103** parents participated in parenting classes to educate and strengthen the family
- Less than 10%** of the first time offending youth in the Teen Court program re-offended after completing the program

Child Abuse Prevention Services



- 125** children received quality respite childcare including a nutritious lunch
- 218** sessions of respite child care was provided
- 52** Foster Care Supportive Visitation parents received education & support services--with a goal of reunifying the family
- 111** parents in the Foster Care Supportive Visitation program received substance abuse assessment, education and support services
- 92%** of parents involved in our Child Abuse Prevention Services programs demonstrated significant improvements in parenting skills, knowledge in parenting and attitudes about parenting their children
- 71** parents received Medicaid Outreach Services

Child Welfare



- 31,427** days of foster care were provided to children placed with us
- 13** children in foster care were successfully reunified with their family
- 34** children were successfully adopted creating new forever families
- 17** new foster homes were licensed to provide foster care for children
- 149** children were served in foster care



Behavioral Health



- 144** individuals received mental health counseling
- 168** youth received substance abuse and/or co-occurring substance abuse and mental health services
- 175** at-risk youth received behavioral health screening and/or assessment

Angel House

- 28** teen mothers in foster care and 26 children were served at Angel House
- 84%** of the mothers improved their independent living skills

MICHELLE

For as long as she could remember, Michelle was being molested by a family member.

The nightmare started when she was about two years old. She told no one out of fear. Her tormentor had threatened her with severe consequences if she told.

As Michelle entered puberty, she began to exhibit symptoms of the abuse, only no one recognized it. She began to drink and take drugs. She developed an eating disorder and started skipping school. Her grades and her social life began to suffer. One time, Michelle was in class and someone made a joke about rape. Michelle lost it completely. She went into a terrible rage.

So much pain had to go somewhere and ultimately it turned to self-hate. She was fighting with her parents every day and nothing could console her.

At sixteen, Michelle was all on her own. She started sleeping on the sofas of a few friends, but when she had worn out her welcome, she ended up on the street. Ultimately, Michelle was completely destitute. She felt more alone than she ever had in her entire life.

— THAT IS WHEN SHE MET SOPHIA —

from our Street Outreach Team—a program of the Gateway Youth Services division of Child and Family Charities.

It came to a point when Michelle did not want to go home anymore — so she *ran away from home*.

After working with Sophia and the Street Outreach team for a while, they got her to agree to go to the only unaccompanied minor shelter in all of the Tri-county area of mid-Michigan: Higher Grounds. Once at Higher Grounds at the Kevin J. Moody Youth Home, Michelle received proper medical attention, healthy food to eat and, most importantly, a chance to talk to someone who would really listen to her.

Michelle and her parents decided the best thing for her was to move into the long term residential program, Crossroads, after completing her 21 day stay in Higher Grounds. While in the Crossroads program, Michelle excelled. She caught up in school, her grades improved, she received counseling, substance

abuse therapy, was taught independent living skills such as learning to balance a checkbook and eat healthy on a budget. She got a job after graduating high school and has transitioned into our Housing Young Families program that offers continued support for youth as they work towards living independently successfully. Michelle now attends classes at LCC—she wants to be a Social Worker and help children who come from a similar background she did when she graduates!

We will be walking alongside Michelle until she no longer needs us.

CHARLES

Juvenile Justice

TEEN COURT

Offering an alternative to youth in crisis. Changing lives for first-time youth offenders.

TEAM ATTENDANCE, TRUANCY OUTREACH

Helping families/keeping kids in school.

Charles, age 17, is a high school student. He was arrested, along with five other youth, for stealing six mopeds.

All six youth were charged with six felony counts of Unlawful Driving Away of a Motor Vehicle. Charles was referred to Teen Court, a program of Child and Family Charities Juvenile Justice Division, by the Prosecutor's Office in February 2018 since he had no previous criminal history prior to this incident.

Charles and his parents agreed to participate in the program instead of sending Charles through formal adjudication where he would have a record remain with him the rest of his life.

PART OF THE TEEN COURT PROCESS

is to assess the whole child—including what is happening at home, school and socially.

Initially we found that this negative behaviour was new to Charles. He had been a happy child with lots of friends and a very good student. But that changed once he started hanging out with some new friends. These so-called friends convinced Charles to try marijuana and other recreational drugs. This led to other activities that were not promoting a healthy lifestyle for a teenager.

After a thorough assessment, part of the Teen Court program, it was determined Charles had some emotional issues that needed attention.



At his Accountability Hearing (presided over by an official Judge, but with peer jurors), Charles said he wanted to change, but that he needed help. The Teen Court counselors assured him that they would be with him every step of the way.

CHARLES FINISHED THE TEEN COURT PROGRAM

It took him only 9 months to complete substance abuse counseling, emotional therapy, street law classes and credit recovery. He made amends for the mopeds he stole and is now on track to graduate in June 2019. Charles has a part-time job, is back to doing well in school and has stopped associating with people whose goals and values do not align with his own.

Charles was successfully discharged in July 2018 with a recommendation that all charges be dismissed.

What is Charles up to now?

Charles has received an offer from a gym in California to begin professional Mixed Martial Arts training in 2019.

OUR DIVISIONS

Through 6 divisions and 23 programs, Child and Family Charities provides services to over 8,000 abused, neglected and at-risk children, youth and families each year in the Greater Lansing Area of Michigan.

Angel House Division is a residential program providing support and new directions for pregnant and parenting teens in foster care and their babies. Through a therapeutic approach, teens are helped to end cycles of abuse and neglect and learn to live independently with their child.

Behavioral Health Division provides mental health counseling for all ages, substance abuse therapy, teen assessment and family counseling.

Child Abuse Prevention Services Division provides the Family Growth Center respite child care program & parenting support, Foster Care Supportive Visitation, Medicaid Outreach, Community Outreach--toy pantry/clothing closet and Nutrition Support for the Lansing area.

Child Welfare Services Division provides foster care, adoption and post adoption support. This division ensures safe and loving homes for abused, neglected and vulnerable children and youth.

Gateway Youth Services Division provides a variety of programs, including the Kevin J. Moody Youth Home shelter and residential program, Housing Youth Families and Street Outreach that help homeless and runaway youth have brighter futures with hope.

Juvenile Justice Services Division helps teens avoid formal adjudication and end negative behaviors through Teen Court and helps kids stay in school through the Truancy Outreach program T.E.A.M. Attendance. The division also provides Street Law and Parenting Support programs and recruits hundreds of local high school teens to volunteer in the accountability hearings as peer jurors.

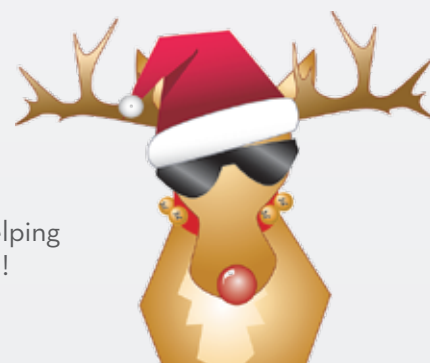
